- Notes:
- A dot over a o-syllabic indicates the vowel /u/: ◁̣ is /no/ while ◁̣̣ is /nu/.
 - The dot over an e-syllabic indicates the /ə/ vowel sound: ◁̣̣̣ is /ne/ while ◁̣̣̣̣ is /nə/.
 - Tone is not generally included when writing in Practical Syllabics. High tone can be indicated with an accent over the syllabic: e.g. ◁̣̣̣̣̣, ◁̣̣̣̣̣̣̣. Tone might only be written: for pedagogical purposes, for a dictionary, or to specifically mark a syllable for tone to disambiguate the word.
 - Tone in Hare functions rather differently than it does in other Dene languages, sometimes moving leftwards in the word off its original location. When it is deemed required to indicate tone, the acute accent will be placed on the original underlying location, not on the syllable to which it moved.
