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1. Where a punctuation key has been remapped, hold down the RIGHT-ALT or OPTION key and type the punctuation. For example, the semicolon ; is typed RIGHT-ALT+; (Windows) or OPTION+; (Mac).
2. Accents are typed after the base letter.
 - a. Apostrophe accent ´ : APOSTROPHE key.
 - b. Háček accent ˘ : EQUALS key.
 - c. The optional acute accent ´ : SHIFT+6
3. An alternate way of typing the superscript letters is to hold down the RIGHT-ALT or OPTION key while pressing either w, z. “z” can be typed RIGHT-ALT+Z (Windows), OPTION+Z (Mac), or by SHIFT+EQUALS. The RIGHT-ALT/OPTION method is the only way to get the capital superscript Z.
4. An alternate way of typing ě and x̣ is to hold down the RIGHT-ALT or OPTION key while pressing either g, x. ‘Ě’ can be typed RIGHT-ALT+G (Windows), OPTION+G (Mac), or by using the háček accent key EQUALS.
4. Proper opening and closing quotation marks have special keys.
 - a. “Double quotes” are SHIFT+COMMA and SHIFT+PERIOD.
 - b. ‘Single quotes’ are SHIFT+7 and SHIFT+8.
 - c. «Double guillemets» are RIGHT-ALT+9 and RIGHT-ALT+0 (Windows) or OPTION+9 and OPTION+0 (Mac).
 - d. ‹Single guillemets› are SHIFT+RIGHT-ALT+9 and SHIFT+RIGHT-ALT+0 (Windows) or SHIFT+OPTION+9 and SHIFT+OPTION+0 (Mac).
